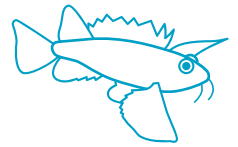

the name ocellated waspfish derives from the eyelike color spot on the dorsal fin. apistus carinatus inhabits soft bottoms of the continental shelves, where he hides during the day buried in the sand with just his eyes exposed.

during the night the waspfish goes hunting: it corners its pray with the colorful protruding pectoral fins. the three sensitive barbels below his mouth help him to locate the prey that is buried in the substrate.

the waspfish belongs to the order of the scorpaeniforms and like scorpion fish or lion fish it protects itself against predators with venomous fin spines. when disturbed it spreads the long pectoral fins, presenting the striking color on the upper side.
